
Rallying the Really Human Things

A CULTURE OF CURIOSITY:


Pursuing Truth with Courage

- C. *Thoughtfully engage emerging technologies,* integrating them into the curriculum where missional, equipping students and families to navigate and employ these tools with wisdom and purpose—for their good, the good of others, and the glory of God.
- D. *Elevate thoughtful storytelling* showcasing the depth and strength of Pacifica's program—positioning the school as a premier high school for intellectual and spiritual formation in Orange County.

- **B.** Enhance professional development through a twofold approach: investing deeply in the formation and ongoing learning of Pacifica staff and fostering collaboration with other educators and schools—advancing a shared vision for educating Christianly. This includes providing the training, tools, and reflective space necessary to carry out the priorities of our Strategic Vision with distinction, clarity, and faithfulness.
- C. **Strengthen athletic coach development** to lead teams shaped by mission, grounded in character, and committed to the student experience at every level. As mentors, Triton coaches shape the hearts, minds, and habits of the next generation—forming student-athletes for life and leadership.

All work is sacred, yet few callings shape the future more than forming children for lives of purpose and faithful contribution.

A Life Fully Lived



- C. A particular focus will be the future Arts & Letters Loft, a vital next step in our vision. This is more than a critically necessary campus expansion; it is a declaration of the value of imagination, dialogue, and creativity in forming students who think and live well and are alive to beauty.
