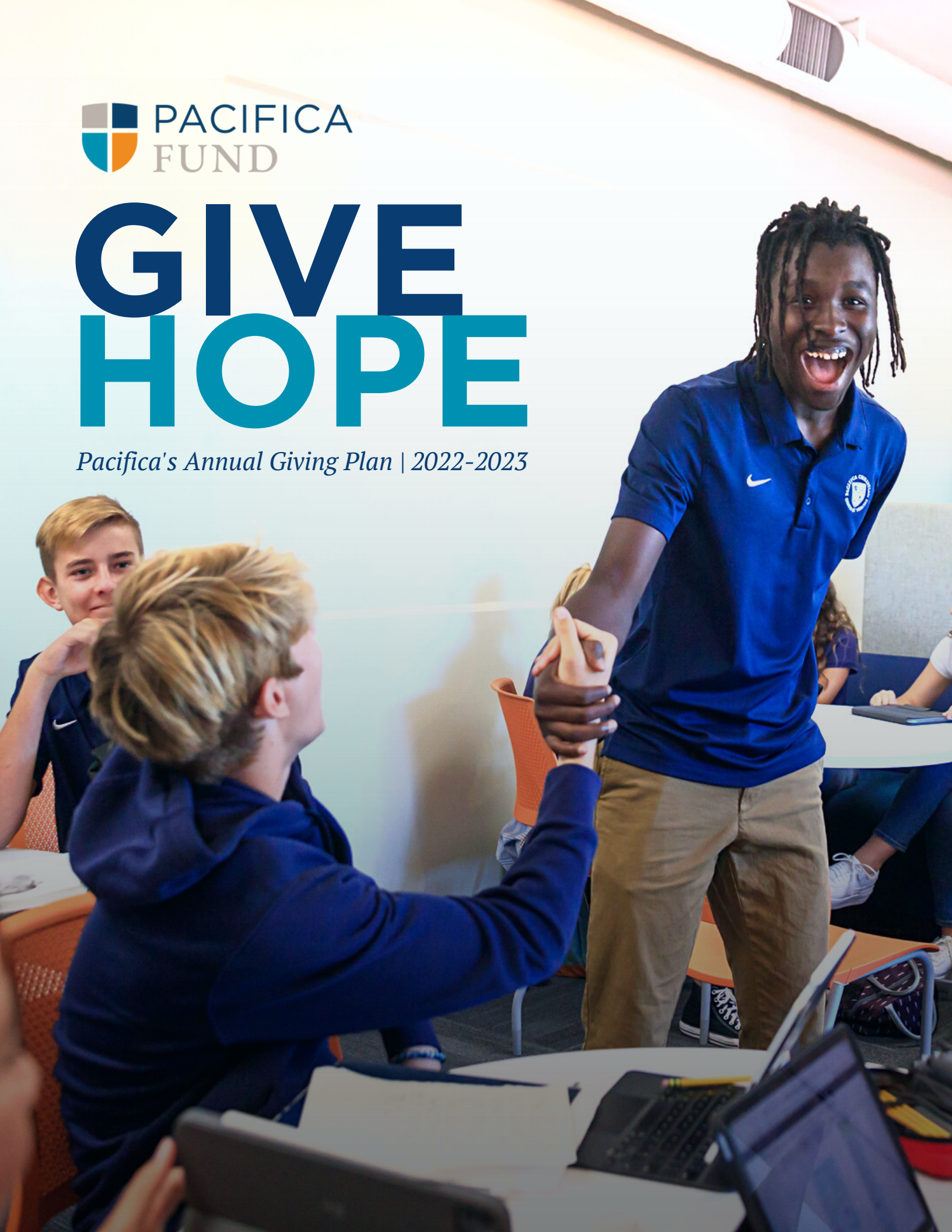

# YOUR STORY

## **AN INSPIRING HISTORY**

Launching Pacifica has been a thrilling endeavor. In 2012, a small group of friends prayerfully dedicated themselves to the call of creating a high school that would engage students' minds and also shape their hearts. Equipped with just \$10,000, the provision of a rented building on 15th Street, a small staff who loved teenagers, and deep faith, Pacifica opened its doors in 2015 to 50 students. To impact more students and to establish a permanent home, in 2017 our community banded together to purchase our 1499 Monrovia Avenue property.

Over the next four and half years, through the sacrificial generosity of those who believed in our mission, we raised over \$13.6M to create a state-of-the-art building from which we can prepare future thinkers and contributors. Opened in February of 2022, this building—named for a significant donation from The Rosalie and Harold Rae Brown Foundation—has become a daily reminder that God's faithful provision comes not only through the legacy of generosity from our community, but also through those, like the Browns, who will never have a family member attend Pacifica.



## A FLOURISHING PRESENT

Pacifica is currently thriving with 279 students, supported by 75+ faculty, staff, and coaches. With five graduating classes, and now recent college graduates heading into the marketplace or pursuing advanced degrees, Pacifica is focusing on our goal of educating between 360-400 students annually.

## A PROMISING FUTURE

Guiding our way is Pacifica's newly launched Strategic Vision—*Pacifica 2025: The Hope Set Before Us*. This detailed roadmap, created to strengthen and enhance all aspects of the Pacifica program, will help us mature into one of the premier schools of our kind and size. **Our goal is to solidify Pacifica as an intellectual and spiritual home for generations of young people while also engaging our broader community in conversations of human flourishing.**

# STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

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## PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Raise \$1.01 million to support faculty and staff, expand offerings in every academic discipline, enhance arts and athletics programs, and launch academic teams while maturing our integrated programs in leadership, service, and scholarship.

## CAPITAL ENHANCEMENTS & CAMPUS EXPANSION

Raise \$650,000 to enrich, modernize, and maximize the use of our campus and enhance the student experience while also contributing to our Strategic Ownership Fund which is vital for future campus expansion.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Raise \$1.24 million to provide Pacifica's distinctive education to outstanding, mission-fit students who would not otherwise be able to attend. Fund tuition assistance for deserving Pacifica students' education for 4 years.

# PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

## FACULTY & STAFF

These highly-qualified men and women seek to educate, lead, challenge, encourage, and set examples of faith, character, and service for each student. Pacifica requires significant resources to attract, compensate well, and retain our dedicated faculty and staff. Investing in their professional development is key to equipping them to grow in their disciplines, encourage curiosity, challenge students to achieve success, and inspire a love for learning.

## SCHOLARSHIP & LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

A Pacifica education trains students to become servant-leaders in all that they do. Academically, several new classes have been added to enhance the curriculum, in addition to the launch of three new Academic Teams—Speech & Debate, Junior Classical League, and Math Team. For leadership development, we will strengthen our Prefect Board with unique opportunities for one-on-one mentoring and bolster our Associated Students leadership organization.

## TRITON ATHLETICS

More than 80% of our students are Triton athletes. Our ability to provide rich and robust experiences for all of these students requires meaningful investment. Pacifica is committed to building an Athletics program that not only provides opportunities for competition but, more importantly, develops character and teaches important life skills. We are also dedicated to covering any and all fees associated with playing sports at Pacifica.


## VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS

Students have ample opportunity to express their creativity and talents in the classroom, on stage, and in the community. Over the past several years, we have consistently increased our course offerings, as well as performance and exhibition opportunities. This year, we continue our program advancement with the addition of both Choir and Dance Team.





# CAPITAL ENHANCEMENTS & CAMPUS EXPANSION



## THE COVE & LEARNING COMMONS AT 15TH STREET CAMPUS

Creating intentional spaces for relationship and learning is essential to the cultivation of culture at Pacifica. The newly renovated Cove and Learning Commons is a place for reading a great book, preparing for an exam, continuing projects for a class, or enjoying time with peers. All freshmen-level study halls are held in Learning Commons and other students will make use of this space throughout the day or after school while waiting for practices to begin.

## STUDENT SUPPORT OFFICE

This new semi-private office space provides desks and conference space for our academic counselors. Additionally, The Cove provides many differentiated spaces for learning, support, and testing.

## DIGITAL MEDIA LAB & TRITON FILM ROOM

The growth of the Digital Arts Program necessitates a more robust space for this creative work to flourish. The new media lab features movable and flexible furniture for adaptable learning and creative environments. It also includes two 85" interactive displays and digital media labs complete with brand new Macbook Pros. After school, this space transforms into the Triton Film Room, where our student-athletes will learn together and form game plans for upcoming competitions.

## CHOIR & PERFORMING ARTS SPACE

With the launching of the Choir Program and Dance Team, alongside the growing needs for Performing Arts, we have combined two classrooms on 15th Street into one large classroom. During the day, this space will be used for Performing Arts, Choir, and other courses. After school, it will be dedicated for the use of the Performing Arts Department for rehearsal and preparation for upcoming performances.

## STRATEGIC OWNERSHIP FUND

To achieve our goal of educating 360-400 students annually, Pacifica will need additional facilities to support all aspects of the school program. The completion of the Building a Home Campaign in early 2022 covered the vast majority of the costs associated with remodeling and equipping Pacifica's new center for learning at 1499 Monrovia, but it was not designed to satisfy all ownership and operational costs. Therefore, the Strategic Ownership Fund was created to raise funds for Pacifica to own 1499 Monrovia outright, which is a priority for two strategic reasons:

- 1) It provides Pacifica with the funds necessary to move quickly in achieving our long-term facility **Master Plan**, most notably our desire to purchase our current property on 15th Street.
- 2) It immediately allows Pacifica to annually invest more money into our student programs, faculty, and financial assistance, not to mention save hundreds of thousands of dollars in interest payments.

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

## A SCHOOL FOR ALL NEIGHBORHOODS

Pacifica is committed to providing our exceptional educational experience to mission-fit students from all backgrounds and neighborhoods. Accordingly, we provide financial assistance to qualified students who could not otherwise attend.

As a community of learners, each person brings a different perspective and life experience, which Pacifica believes is essential to acquiring not only knowledge, but also wisdom and understanding. Pacifica needs your help to ensure funds are available to provide our transformative education to outstanding students.

# A **NEW** GIVING OPPORTUNITY

## THE PACIFICA ENDOWMENT

In the spring of 2022, generous friends of Pacifica gave \$600,000 to officially launch the Pacifica Endowment. The school has agreed to match these initial funds in a timely manner as we pursue our initial goal of raising \$5 million in gifts and pledges. Ultimately, as a part of our strategic vision, we desire to raise \$20 million for this endowment. Gifts to the Pacifica Endowment are over and above donations to the annual *Pacifica Fund*.
